Fun Facts:

Suzanne began her first novel in Sept. 2002, the morning her youngest child got onto the school bus for her first day of school. Just after the bus drove away, Suzanne hurried to her computer and registered for a writing class at the University of Washington and has been writing ever since.

Kids often ask when she decided she wanted to become a writer. "I've always loved telling stories. I get that from my Norwegian father. In elementary school I created picture books and wrote plays. But I didn't know any writers when I was growing up and it took me a very long time to work up the courage to attempt a novel."

At Bennington College, she studied modern dance. She transferred to Occidental College and studied film making. Then she started a video production company with a friend, then went to the University of WA for her masters degree in Communications. "I didn't really know what to do with myself. I worked at a television station for a while, and as a marketing director for a nonprofit. All the while I was creating picture books and writing stories. But I didn't try to get published. Then I got married and had babies and decided to stay home and take care of them. I put the storytelling away for many years."

Suzanne was born in a U.S. army hospital in Munich, Germany. Her father was stationed there during the Vietnam War, having been drafted by Army Intelligence. A few years later they moved back to Bainbridge Island, WA, where her father had grown up. He worked as a school teacher and fished the Bering Sea during the summer months. Her mother started selling real estate when Suzanne was in middle school.

Bainbridge is still Suzanne's home.

She is married to Bob, an airline pilot and has two children, Walker and Isabelle. She has a dog named Skylos and a cat named Daisy.
